This funding will be used to

- Improve outcomes (retention and engagement) for **First Nations** students
- Implement targeted **Visible Learning** strategies with fidelity
- Enhance a targeted whole school approach to differentiated teaching of **Reading**
- Increase whole school **attendance** | 90% attendance and 30% school cohort <85%
- Enhance **Case Management** processes and coaching model for priority groups, Tier II/III students and identified students (Next Steps, Year 13 Data)
- Increase **School Based Traineeship offerings** | Increase opportunities for students to engage meaningfully in the workplace
- Increase **enrichment opportunities** | Increase opportunities for students to engage in activities to enhance their health and wellbeing.

Our initiatives include

- **First Nations** | Fostering an environment of high expectations, connection to culture, and continuing personal growth
- **Visible learning**
 - Training teachers to select appropriate pedagogical strategies to improve student outcomes
 - Enhance internal and external learning spaces to promote the third teacher and collaborative learning spaces
- **Reading** | Implementation of a whole school reading approach and a Junior Secondary tiered reading intervention program
- **Attendance** | Enhance attendance team to provide timely support and intervention for disengaged learners
- **Case Management** | Continue to support the adjusted delivery of flexible learning programs, culturally sensitive mentoring and Year 13 Broker pilot
- **SBT offerings** | Increase SBT opportunities linked to current DBSHS certificates
- **Enrichment Opportunities** | Implementation of a Volleyball Development Program



Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employing additional staff to support: the whole school approach to reading; restorative processes; increase student belonging and attendance; enhance targeted support for First Nations students; and increase opportunities for students to engage meaningfully in the workplace (\$430,000)
- Investing in technology to build capability across the whole school to leverage technology in the classroom (\$143,564)
- Transforming and modernising internal and external learning spaces to support and engage the learner and encourage collaborative learning (\$120,000)
- Supporting health and wellbeing initiatives, such as sport development (\$12,000)
